



This project was necessary because this school in the province of Tena, Ecuador also functions as a day care center, as part of a national day care program called INNFA (National Family and Childhood Institute). INNFA is a program, similar to the Wawa Wasi program in Peru, for low-income families who can't afford to send their children to school.

All students, young children, and teachers were previously using only one old and run-down bathroom; for this reason, MEDLIFE pledged to construct two new hygienic bathroom facilities in this community.

In July of 2012, Mobile Clinic participants from universities across the U.S. joined community members to construct the new bathroom. At the end of the week the school's director expressed her gratitude, promising to take care of and maintain the new facilities.
